Are solar panels not allowed on roofs

Solar panels offer a sleek, attractive design that can be installed on any type of roof. Open tube panels prevent moisture build up, keeping the roof surface dry. If you live in a region that experiences heavy wind or snow, solar panels are even weather-tested to handle harsh conditions.

Are solar panels illegal?

Technically, no state outlaws or bans solar panels; quite the opposite. Most states have solar access laws that forbid any agreement, covenant, condition, bylaw, or contract that outlaws or limits solar installations by Homeowners Associations (HOA) or other municipal bodies.
