Czech Home Portable Energy Storage Project



Overview

Are there any large-scale electricity storage projects in the Czech Republic?

There are no other larger-scale electricity storage projects currently being developed in the Czech Republic. However, the Czech government provides subsidies to household projects consisting of photovoltaic panels with electricity storage systems.

Is there a future for energy storage in the Czech Republic?

Despite the ongoing discussions, there is no significant development in the area of energy storage. In 2015, the Czech Government adopted the National Action Plan for Smart Grids (“NAPSG”) prepared by the Ministry of Industry and Trade under principles set out in the update of the State Energy Concept, which was also introduced in 2015.

What will the Czech electricity storage scheme do in 2025?

In an announcement released on March 7, 2025, the executive arm of the European Union said that the Czech scheme will support the installation of at least 1.5 GWh of new electricity storage facilities. The measure will be open to all storage technologies directly connected to the transmission network or distribution network.

Does the Czech government provide subsidies for electricity storage?

However, the Czech government provides subsidies to household projects consisting of photovoltaic panels with electricity storage systems. Batteries and thermal energy storage are the two most commonly used methods of electricity storage for households in the Czech Republic. 2.

How does the Czech government subsidise photovoltaic panels?

The Czech government subsidises the installation of photovoltaic panels located on domestic properties producing energy for their own consumption and the purchase of co-located energy storage solutions. These subsidies are

provided under the “New Green Savings Programme” administered by the State Environmental Fund.

How will Czech state aid help a net-zero economy?

The aid will take form of direct grants which will cover up to 50% of the investment cost of supported projects. From ESS News The European Commission (EC) has authorized a €279 million (\$303 million) Czech state aid scheme to support investment into electricity storage facilities and foster the transition towards a net-zero economy.
