# Is solar power station energy storage developing

The AES Lawai Solar Project in Kauai, Hawaii has a 100 megawatt-hour battery energy storage system paired with a solar photovoltaic system. Sometimes two is better than one. Coupling solar energy and storage technologies is one such case. The reason: Solar energy is not always produced at the time.

Developers and power plant owners plan to add 62.8 gigawatts (GW) of new utility-scale electric-generating capacity in 2024, according to our latest Preliminary Monthly Electric Generator Inventory. This addition would be 55% more added capacity than the 40.4 GW added in 2023 (the most since 2003).

According to EIA's latest Preliminary Monthly Electric Generator Inventory report, the U.S. power grid is expected to add 63 gigawatts (GW) of new utility-scale electric-generating capacity in 2025. Most of this growth will come from solar power and energy storage, showing strong momentum for clean.
